West Texas wind and other wonders

As it roars through this area, I wondered how much wind, how many cubic feet of air, has passed through the area during this windy season? It must be thousands of cubic feet per second, if not more That got me to thinking about other big numbers in

nature. Niagara Falls sees 600,000 gallons of water flow over it ever second. The Mississippi River flows about 4.5 million gallons into the Gulf of Mexico every second, and the Amazon River discharges 55 million gallons per second. Think of that: every second, every day, all day and all night, the water flows. Right now, even as you read this. And that's just three rivers. God moves a lot of water, doesn't He?

This got me to wondering about other big numbers found in nature, so I looked up a little information. At one time, there were 60-75 million head of buffalo in the United States. Before the Passenger Pigeon was hunted into extinction, scientists estimate their population was close to 5 billion. They made up 40% of ALL the birds in North America, and a single flock could be a mile wide and three miles long. A single flock could block out the sun for hours, even days when it was on the move

It is staggering to make some of these large number make sense, isn't it? Yet how do we quantify the love of God? Just how do you measure love, anyway? Think of the 7,068,552,625 (7 billion) people in the world today. (This number is current as I write this, but it will be larger when you read it). God knows and loves every single one of them. Jesus willingly gave his life for each person who makes up that number. But dig a little deeper. It is estimated that somewhere between 69 and 110 billion people have existed over the course of human history. God loved them too. Even without contemplating the quality of God's love, we are clearly incapable of comprehending the quantity of God's love. But just because you can't understand it, it can still be true, can't it?. God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son. When you figure out the why and the how of that, call me, please.

God's excess is humbling. The expression of His creativity in nature is amazing. The abundance we see in nature is a revelation of how much He loves us. God reveals Himself in nature, and I believe we see the scope of His love in the extravagance, the incomprehensible numbers His creation produces. So as you marvel at how the wind blows, as you ponder the number of leaves on the trees, blades of grass, grains of sand and stars in the sky, remember this: the God who never runs out of anything will never run out of love for any of us. Blow, Spirit, blow.

The Texas A&M Agri-Life Extension Agent Jacque Behrens and Program Assistant Sheila Van Zant provide part of our Food Pantry ministry every second Friday. They teach small group nutrition classes called "Three Easy Bites." The three segments are Start with Breakfast, Snack Right, and Build a Healthy Plate, with one segment being presented each month. The classes include a recipe demonstration, with samples offered to the Food Pantry clients as they wait in Fellowship Hall.

Linda Alastuey, the local Wesley Nurse for Methodist Healthcare Ministries, facilitates a Diaper Pantry and parenting program on the second Tuesday of each month at 10:00 in our building. The focus is on health and safety issues, child development, and various health topics such as dental health. Jacque Behrens presents part of the class. Dr. Susan Delk was a guest presenter for the session on dental health. Each participant receives a free package of diapers, provided by a grant from Wal-Mart.

Mrs. Alastuey also presents a program each month on health and wellness for the children in the Godly Impressions Pre-School. At the Food Pantry food most distribution, she provides information to the clients on health and safety issues.
