As you probably know, George Jones passed away last week. He was a legend in country music, having (among other notable accomplishments,) a number one single in each of the five decades from the 1950s through the 2000s.

One of the biggest George Jones hits was "Who's Gonna Fill Their Shoes?" It is a song about the loss of several notable county music singers that wonders how country music will survive and flourish without their continued presence.

That is a question most pastors wonder every Sunday morning, as we look out over our flocks. The Church in America is aging and shrinking. I honestly think the only time I put on shoes was to go to church. Kids can get by without wearing shoes, without having to fill shoes. Childhood is over. Put on your shoes. You may or may not be called to fill someone else's, but you are certainly called to leave some shoes for someone else to fill one day.
