There is an old Aladdin brass lamp in my office that has a nice Courier and Ives globe shade on it. I converted the lamp to use a light bulb, so it would be both functional and decorative. But I have never used it for a lamp. It's too nice, worth too much (to me) and in general is irreplaceable. If it were to fall, the globe would certainly break, and the lamp would most likely get dented or even bent. So it sits on a shelf, never being used for the purpose it was created.

Have you allowed some things in your life to become decorative rather than functional? Things that have value and are certainly worth protecting and preserving, but are no longer being used because you fear they are too valuable to risk being exposed to the dangers of everyday use?

I think the Gospel sometimes gets put in this category of "too precious to risk." Is it special? Certainly. Is it beautiful? Yes, it is. Is it valuable? Without a doubt. So we keep it safe, locked in our hearts and lives, where we know it will not be rejected, refused or abused by those who do not love it as much as we

I have a couple of other old "treasures." I have a Skil saw that was my Grandpa's. It was his birthday present in 1959. I also have one of his old, red fiberglass handled claw hammers. They do not stay on the shelf. They get used every time I need to ruin a piece of lumber. And every time I put them to work, I think of Grandpa: how he loved me, and how his eyes twinkled; the smell of chewing tobacco and how his whiskers scratched my face when he hugged me. I would give you the lamp, but I believe I would fight you over the saw and the hammer.

If you're not putting the Gospel to work, I doubt you're thinking very much about the one who gave it to you. The less you put the Gospel of Jesus to work, the less you get it out and use it, live it, and love it, the less you value it. The Gospel can't be broken, lost, or devalued if it used. In fact, the more you engage it, the more you put it to work, the more powerful and precious it becomes to you. So get the Gospel you love and treasure (and yourself) off the shelf, and put both of them to work. That's what they were made for.

Former church member loses home in Moore, OK, tornado

Note: Sam Telford is the third son of Mike and Sandra Telford of Arlington, formerly of Brady. Mike was our youth minister and FLC director for several years. Sam is married to Brandi. They have two children: Ryleigh Madison (2 yrs. old) and Cade Christopher (3 weeks old). The following information is from Sandra:

Sam and his family lost everything during the massive EF5 tornado that hit Moore, Okla on May 20, 2013. Their home took a direct hit...they were in a neighbor's storm cellar, and we are so thankful for that! When they were finally able to get out of the storm cellar due to all the debris, they realized that the only possessions they had left, literally were the clothes on their backs and 2 diapers for baby Cade. They didn't even have shoes on their feet!! They lost their 2 vehicles too....one was thrown 125 yards from their house, the other was in their garage.

We have spent the last week digging through all the rubble...our main goal was to find Dallas (Boxer) the family pet, Sam's discharge papers from the Marines (DD214) and Brandi's wedding ring...by God's Grace we were able to find them all...yes, even the wedding ring. We give God all the praise and glory for leading us to each!!! Dallas was found by a family who took him in, bathed him, and fed him...he has some injuries but the vet took care of him. He told Sam that Dallas is one tough dog!!

The home was rental property and thankfully they had renter's insurance!! As for now they are going to stay in a garage apt at her dad's house in Moore. They plan on looking for a new home there...mom isn't liking that decision but will support them and continue to pray for them daily!!

Sam is an Aviation Mechanic at the OKC airport...he has to return to work tomorrow. Brandi is a stay-at-home mom. Brandi and the kids are here in Arlington and plan on returning to Oklahoma this weekend to be with Sam.

There has been an abundance of clothes new and used given to them. Not to sound ungrateful, but we are running out of room!! Cade had been blessed with a ton of diapers and baby wipes too! :)

It still feels like a dream and any minute they are going to wake up...we still cry when we talk about it!

We praise the Lord that He has allowed us more time with our loved ones and we aren't having to plan 4 funerals....as many families in Moore are. We are praying for all in Moore during this heartbreaking time!

- 42 adults 65 and older June food distribution will be Friday, June 14, from 10:00 to 12:00. July's date will be Friday, July 12, at those same times.




Church-wide summer fellowship
