A perfect Christmas

'Tis the season... for nativity scenes. Some people collect them and have spent a lot of money on them. Some people just put a plastic Jesus in the front yard and call it good. The variety found in nativity scenes is amazing. Most of them are pretty standard, with the baby Jesus, Mary, Joseph, then becoming more elaborate, as an angel or two, shepherds, and even the wise men are added. Livestock and hay are always a nice touch too.

We tend to think of the manger scene as quiet and dignified. It is always a serene setting: the animals are still, sleeping with their legs folded under them; the shepherds and wise men may point, but they always seem to be whispering. Jesus is asleep, Mary is resting, and Joseph just stands at the back, not saying much.

I doubt it was really like that.

The hay was probably dirty, the animals were... well, they were animals. They moved around, they made noise and they stunk. The shepherds were of the lowest class of people in Israel, so untrusted that their testimony was not allowed in court. And they smelled like sheep. Mary was probably exhausted, and I bet Joseph had a lot on his mind too. And let's don't get started on the wise men. They were still en route, late like a certain relative you could name.

We do the same thing with Christmas. We expect it to look like a Norman Rockwell or Thomas Kinkaid painting, and it usually turns out like a Jeff Foxworthy story. The tree falls over or the lights don't work, Christmas dinner isn't perfect, you don't know what to get half of your family anymore, and the kids that aren't already fighting again are glued to their stupid iphones, texting their friends about how lame Christmas is. **That** is our manger scene.

Christmas is certainly a time for solemnity and reflection. But it is a holiday that involves people, and so it is going to be imperfect. It will not be understood perfectly, and it will not be expressed perfectly.

So remember this: the only thing perfect about Christmas is Jesus, so lighten up a little bit. There's no pressure to perform. God has taken care of all the arrangements, hasn't He? It's all been handled. All you have to do is love. I will say that again. All you have to do is love. Be like the shepherds and just show up and be amazed at what God has done.

So if your family nativity scene looks more like a train wreck or Mr. Bean's, (Google it), don't despair. It's probably a lot closer to Mary and Joseph's first Christmas than the one in the front yard or on the mantle.


