Tire kits, lost sons, and joy

The worst thing about moving is not the packing, not the loading, not the unloading, and not the unpacking. The worst part of moving is not being able to find stuff that you know you own. You need a simple item, like in my case, a plug to fix a hole in a tire. I have a kit made up of all my tire-fixing stuff, so I can find it all in the same place.

Well, you know what happened. I have a flat tire. I dig through all my junk, box after box, no luck. So after an hour, I break down and go to Wal-Mart, pay my eight bucks for yet another tire plug kit, and go home and fix my tire. The next day, I am moving stuff and there is my tire fixing kit. All I could do was add the new stuff to the old, (I can now plug 167 tires, by the way), and go back to what I was doing.

Here is the lesson, the immutable law of the universe that I knew would be enforced at my expense: "The surest way to find what you lost is to go buy its replacement." If you like, since Murphy has a law named after him, you can name the one I mentioned after me.

The worst of all of this is not the losing, it's the finding. I wasn't happy I found my lost stuff, I was re-aggravated at remembering the searching, the inconvenience, and the unnecessary expenses of my time and money.

Jesus talked about losing and finding - the expense and trouble of looking for a lost coin, the difficulty and danger of searching for a lost sheep, and a father's patient longing for a lost son. In all of these parables, the reaction to finding that which was lost was joy. Not irritation, not resignation, not fussing and griping. Just joy. No recrimination, no blame, just joy. The relief, the end of the lostness, brought only joy.

I think there's a lesson in this, maybe several. The lost don't get lost on purpose. The lost don't get lost just to inconvenience me. The lost can't get found unless someone looks for them.

And this: there is joy in the finding. The woman, the shepherd and the father rejoiced. And just as there is joy for the finder, we need to remember there is also joy for the found. I don't know how the coin and the sheep felt, but the prodigal son was pretty happy he had a home to come back to. Maybe the reason we often have so little joy is that we are not finding that which was lost. We talk about the Master's business, but are we doing any of it? It is not our joy that is lost, it is our love for the lost, our remembrance "that I once was lost, but now am found." It seems that is where there is some joy to be found. We wait for the Lord to give us joy, when maybe we ought to be out finding it.


We are so very thankful for our mission leaders who give so much time to the children on Wednesday nights.


