Uncharted waters of imagination

How good is your imagination? How does it affect your life and your future? I just heard on the news that searchers have found a large debris field that is most likely Malaysian Airlines flight 370. If it is in fact the remains of the flight, tragedy will take the place of hope and facts will supplant mystery.

For weeks, we have been bombarded with theories of what could have happened, from UFOs and "shadow planes" to terrorist hijackings and the mental state of the flight crew. The number of possible landing strips and motives offered by the media were nearly endless. I think the imagination and speculation injected into this situation were neither responsible nor healthy.

There are times when we must guard our imagination. All too often we build a plausible (but false) reality in our mind, based on what someone told us, or what we thought we heard someone say. Malaysian flight 370 is an example of imagination run amuck.

On the other hand, what if we would dare to place our imagination under the control of the Holy Spirit? What if we dare to imagine what God could do if we had the courage (imagination) to ask Him? To dare to believe in and ask for renewal for ourselves, salvation for others, and for God to pour out His Spirit on, of all people, us?

Jesus said "You have not because you ask not." What do you not dare to ask for? Peace? Forgiveness? Salvation? Something you don't deserve? Do you have the imagination (courage) to imagine yourself as not only as forgiven, but as a forgiver?

I think that faith and imagination have a relationship we should explore. Dare to ask for the unimaginable. Why limit God to doing only the things you have seen or you can imagine? Stretch your imagination through your prayers. The motto of the British Special Air Services is "He Who Dares Wins." What are you daring, what are you imagining in your prayers? Turn your imagination over to the Lord; to the Holy Spirit. Stop asking God to do the things you can imagine, and start asking God to do things He can imagine.




