Well, school has started again, and many are getting back into their school-time routine. For the next nine months or so, many of us already know exactly what we can and can't do, where we can and can't go, and that we can't leave until Friday afternoon and that we must be back Sunday night, in time for school. Routines are handy. They help us get where we need to be when we need to be there. John Archibald Wheeler said, "Time is what prevents everything from happening at once," and a routine is often critical to keeping everything from happening at once, or not ever happening at all.

But there is danger in routine, isn't there? Remember the Dunkin Donuts man who eventually met himself coming and going, saying "Time to make the donuts" as he passed himself? The danger of routines is that they allow us to live on autopilot, never having to think, never engaging life, never appreciating the moment, smelling the roses, or enjoying the ride. The textures of life become flattened out, and all the colors run together into gray.

If we are not careful, this can happen in our faith-life as well. The routine becomes the rut. G. K. Chesterton said, "If you look at a thing 999 times, you are perfectly safe; if you look at it for the 1000th time, you are in danger of seeing it for the first time." The routine of church, of "doing the things I do because I am a Christian," can become a spiritual routine and rote that allow the life and light to fade from our faith. I hope that Experiencing God will help you to break out of your safe religious routine, and examine Scripture, God, and your personal faith relationship in a new light.

The Lord has really been working in the community of Brady. This ministry opened its doors on January 4, 2012 with 9 children enrolled in the preschool program. As of August 26, 2014, we have 27 children in our preschool program, 12 toddlers, 4 infants, and out of those children, we have 27 that stay all day. We have a grand total of 43 children enrolled. I don't know about you, but I can only stand back and look around me in total and utter amazement! Praise God!

We had a great turnout for our "Meet the Teacher" night on August 17<sup>th</sup>, we only had 4 families that did not make it. A huge thank you goes out to Susan Turk, Lynn Munden, and Stephanie McKay for cooking the hot dogs, cupcakes and serving up the drinks. And thank you to our newest preschool board member, Shelly Bean, for her new and creative ideas, and for making the "goody bags" for all the students.

Shelly has come up with two different ways that the church members can get more involved with their preschool ministry. One way is to become a "Prayer Partner". Just pray for a specific child and their family every week. Find the black box in most Sunday school classrooms, pull out a card, pray all week, and return that card the next Sunday. Please write a short message on the card or you can just sign your name. On Monday, those cards will be sent home with those children. The second way is to become a "Rocking Reader." All you do is fill out a form, and Shelly will give you the times that you can come visit the classroom. You will pick a child and just read a short story to them. It's all very easy and it is such a great way to minister to a child and their family.

On Monday, September 8<sup>th</sup>, we will be hosting "Grapes for Grandparents", in honor of Grandparents Day on September 7<sup>th</sup>. The grandparents of our students are invited to come and have a special snack of grapes with their grandchild. We will gladly appreciate donated grapes by the church members.

For the month of September the children will be learning about "My Amazing Body", the letters "A", "B", "H", the number "9", the color "brown" and the shape of a "circle".

The Bible lesson for the month is "God Cares about My Body" featuring the story "The Miracles of Jesus." Our monthly Bible verse is "I praise you God, I am wonderfully made." Psalm 139:14




