Danger Signs

The holiday season's assault on our weight is just about to begin. We will snack on Halloween candy until Thanksgiving, eat leftovers for a few days, and then the Christmas parties begin. We usually finish up the season of eating with a New Year's Eve party.

It's no mystery why so many have health issues, is it? A little cake, a little pie, a few candy bars, and voila! You're pre-diabetic. And a few pounds overweight. And your blood pressure is up a little, which is a nice complement to your new higher cholesterol numbers.

By themselves, none of these issues are life-threatening. Annoying? Yes, but nothing we can't live with—for a time. However, if you let these health problems continue, grow, and then work together, you have the beginnings of some serious health problems.

That's how most people get seriously ill. They start off small and slow, ignore bad habits and see their health slip away. Catastrophic health issues often have a long history of building up to a critical level that is difficult, if not impossible to reverse.

The same is often true for a church. There are issues that we learn to live with: ways of thinking and doing that in isolation are not too dangerous to our health, but when allowed to work in concert, do great damage.

As a church consultant, Thom Rainer of LifeWay has identified ten issues, events, processes, mindsets, etc. that are common to churches that are in danger of losing their health and their lives. I find most of these symptoms are interrelated. They are mutually supportive, and any one of them produces the seeds of several others. They are not easy to deal with. I hope you will prayerfully read his list and see where we are in need of changing our church's lifestyle. I'm not going to define or elaborate on these symptoms. I'll just let you prayerfully reflect on the appropriateness of each one to our setting:

Slow erosion.

The past is the hero.

The church refused to look like the community.

The budget moved inwardly.

The Great Commission becomes the Great Omission.

The Preference-Driven Church.

Pastoral tenure decreases.

The church rarely prayed together.

The church had no clear purpose.

The church obsessed over the facilities.

These are danger signs, like shortness of breath or dizzy spells—things that sneak up on us and slowly diminish our health and our ability to engage life. Or in the case of a church, reduce its ability to engage the Great Commission and the Gospel. We are in the early stages of addressing some of our health issues. I hope you will commit yourself to the honesty and the effort and the process it will take to make the changes we need to make to become a healthier church.

So let's put down the candy bars and drumsticks, eat our spiritual broccoli and exercise our faith.

We loaded five school busses with about 190 students from Brady Middle School and Brady High School.

Our numbers seemed down this year but after looking over the Brady section that was second in size only to Brownwood ISD. I think that more students drove over themselves. (I'm guessing around 240 Brady students in all).

We had a great time listening to and singing praise songs and then several youth from the Brownwood area spoke, giving their testimony and telling others what God and the saving Grace of Jesus Christ has meant to them. After that, a speaker came up to challenge all who attended to take a careful look at their lives and just where Jesus Christ was at in their own life story. (This was an eye opener for everyone, very convicting.)

Each day I get to interact with today's youth and it isn't hard to tell that there is a yearning for something in their lives. This event, Fields of Faith may be the only opportunity that some kids have to go with their peers and set down to hear the plan of Salvation set out so simply to them.

Each year we see tears rolling down the faces of students, the red swollen eyes and the heart felt emotions pouring out. It is plain to see that Christ was at work(in a football stadium) and that the fields truly are white for harvest.

We do not have any numbers yet on how many decisions were made, but if only one life was changed, then I'll count this as a successful night.

Also, thank you for all the donations that were sent in, we actually had some money left over and this will be used to send students to a leadership camp or FCA sports camp this summer.

If you get a chance, give our Superintendent of schools a call and let him know how much we appreciate the use of the school busses for this event. (Not all schools will allow the use of school busses to an event like this and our administration here in Brady has never questioned or batted an eye.)

Just because you compete doesn't mean you're going to win, but if you never compete you'll never win. As a Christian, go out today and compete, for the winning team of Jesus Christ.
