Texas Baptist Men, missionaries to Nigeria, visit FBC

Four representatives from the Texas Baptist Men's Water Ministry visited our church on the weekend of January 17-18.

Harold Patterson, Tim Wind, Phil Davenport, and Julio Campo their well-drilling demonstrated operation on the Elliott's ranch on Saturday. Their portable, simple machine is used to drill water wells in Third World countries.

The team also shared information about their ministry following a fellowship meal Saturday night and during Sunday School.

Also visiting were Fred and Mary Kay Posey, missionaries in Eku, Nigeria, through Walking in Love Ministries. During worship on Sunday morning the Poseys shared about their ministry in this village in southern Nigeria. They are involved with work in a hospital, school, seminary, orphanage, and leper colony.

Mary Kay was born in Nigeria to SBC missionary parents. She and her husband returned to work there after his retirement. They live in Forney, TX, but go to Nigeria frequently.

The TBM team has drilled wells in Eku, training local men to use the equipment to drill additional wells. They are currently in India on mission to drill more wells and share the Gospel.

On Wednesday, February 11th, Ms. Megan's Class will be




