Doing the small stuff

As I write this, I am at the (lack of) mercy of oak and pecan pollen. Those invisible little spores are killing me. You may have heard the expression "Don't sweat the small stuff, and it's all small stuff." Don't you believe it. Small things often pack a punch that is far out of proportion to their size. Gulliver learned about the power of small when he met the Lilliputians, and in War of the Worlds, it was the common cold virus that brought down the unstoppable Martian invasion. If you still don't agree with me about the power of the small thing, go stand in a fire ant mound for a few seconds.

So-we know there is power in small things. Why do we ignore them and their power? There is great power in a simple compliment or a sarcastic remark. Both are small, done in passing, but one heals, the other wounds. One builds up, the other tears down. There is great power in either an act of kindness or in ignoring the need of another. One says, "I recognize your existence and your value;" the other says, "I refuse to recognize your existence or your value."

We all have the opportunity to give dozens of blessings every day. Almost all of these blessings are small. Or at least they seem small to us. They cost us little, if anything. But the kind word, the little act of kindness, the smile or phone call you make--that small thing-may be the highlight of someone's day. Jesus turns our value system upsidedown when he remembers and values the small blessings in Matthew 25:35-36. That meal, visit, change of clothes or a cup of water take on eternal significance and become valued all out of proportion to their cost as He continues in verses 40-46.

So I tell you this truth: Don't just sweat the small stuff, do the small stuff. Life is made up of small stuff, of small moments, small opportunities taken by small people, of small mercies extended by and to small people. Greatness is conferred by Christ Himself on those who recognize that Kingdom work and Kingdom opportunities are all around them, looking like small things.
