### Choose ye this day. . . but choose wisely.

In case you hadn't heard, we are in an election year. While the candidates will be working to prove how different they are from their opponents, they all have one thing in common: they want your vote.

Your vote. You will be encouraged over the television, radio, the phone, by mail-out and in person to vote. You will be told of the power of your vote: that you can make or change history. You will be reminded of the value of your vote: that men and women served and sacrificed so you could have a vote to cast. Candidates will talk about your responsibility to vote; your civic duty. Others will call your vote a privilege, and speak about oppressive governments that do not allow the people to choose their leaders.

Your vote, your right, your duty, your obligation, your opportunity. The importance of you and your vote. Cast it wisely, because (unless you live in Chicago), you only get one vote.

Democracy (and the voting that comes with it) is not Christian. Democracy is at least 2600 years old, the result of probably Mesopotamian, Indian, and then Greek thought. Democracy is one of the high points of the philosophy of Modernity, which gradually brought us to see the value of the individual, and the right to vote is a powerful expression of the value of the individual. Voting is American, but isn't automatically Christian.

There seems to be a serious lack of voting in the Bible. There are a few times we see voting in Scripture, but except for Acts 6, I can't think of a time voting reflected and was congruent with the will of God. The biblical community, whether it is found in the New or Old Testament, is not based on individual rights. It is based on God's grace and sovereignty. The biblical community says "Thy will be done", not "My will" or "Our will be done". The biblical community (we would call that a church today) understands it is made up of individuals who are learning to value the needs of others above their personal and constitutional rights. The citizens of a biblical community are often in the process of learning to give up their worldly rights, (1 Cor. 6, 8 & 9), and are learning to exercise their Kingdom rights: the right to forgive and be forgiven, the right to go the extra mile and the right to turn the other cheek, and the right to pray for their persecutors as well as their brothers and sisters. They are exercising their right to bear one another's burdens, and the right to be lovingly confronted and corrected.

Voting is, in some way, just a special time to choose, and we choose all the time. That's a right from God, not the Constitution. I believe it is more important that you vote every day to love your neighbor as yourself, than who you vote for in the election. It is more important that you vote to forgive someone who dared to offend you than it is to vote in November.

But go vote, by all means. It is one of your rights and responsibilities as an American. But remember this: you, Christian, live under the authority of a king, not a president. The King doesn't ask for your vote, He expects your obedience. You are a slave, you are not free. Your allegiance is already pledged, your choice was made when you took up your cross. Your God will save you, not a politician. Let that truth guide you as you vote.
