## Updates from Feb. 25 business meeting

The deacon-led Wednesday night **men's Bible study** continues to grow, with 16 in attendance the last two weeks. The deacons will have a training session on March 23, led by Don Fawcett.

The clean-up and organization of the **Music Room** continues. The HOT Baptist Encampment was given all the no-longer-used sound equipment. Much of the remaining (old) sheet music and music books are being offered to a church in Kerrville.

The **roofing project**, done by West Texas Commercial Roofing, will begin this week—February 26-March 1. (Update: work began on Tuesday, Feb. 27.) The project should take about a week.

Much work has been done in the **Family Life Center** in advance of the county's use of the building as a polling place on March 4-5. Plumbing problems have been dealt with, damaged sheet rock has been replaced, tiles have been reset, lockers removed, and most walls have been freshly painted.

The church approved a new **supplemental logo** designed by Valerie Gonzalez. You'll soon have an opportunity to purchase a new FBC tee-shirt.

## For and about our youth

Is your church or mentoring program creating a sustainable faith beyond high school, middle school, or grade school? A new standard for viable youth ministry should be – not the number of attenders, the sophistication of the events, or the “cool” factor of the youth group- but whether teens have the commitment, passion and resources to pursue Christ intentionally and wholeheartedly after they leave the youth ministry.

Youth ministry is about 150 years old. Arising at first as a way of reaching out to troubled teens, especially in highly industrialized urban centers, parachurch ministries like the YMCA sought to provide safe activities and education in basic reading along with evangelism. Throughout the 19th century organizations grew. Bible societies and Sunday School movements increasingly supplanted the ordinary structures, resources, and content of church traditions.

However, the youth group emerged as its own “church-within-a-church,” distinct from the public ministry and worship. It has been increasingly easy for one to go from the nursery to children's church to youth group and on to college without having actually belonged to the local church. For many, the church is more a cafeteria of ministry offerings than a communion of saints.

As we prayerfully follow God's lead this year, may we also endeavor to understand God's way of discipleship and training for our ministries.

We recently participated in the Fellowship of Christian Athletes (FCA) at the local high school. FCA started in 1954 and has 20,297 certified huddles. We are honored to be able to be a part of this program. The program incorporates coaches, campuses, students, and church ministries with integrated ages of participation.

Crossing the church generation gap as spoken in Psalm 145:4 is a wonderful blessing for a church body: *One generation commends Your works to another; they tell of Your mighty acts.*



## Passing of Bro. Ray Ash

Bro. Ray Ash, our beloved former pastor, passed away in San Angelo on Saturday, February 24. He was 86.

A Celebration of Life will be held at First Baptist Church Mason (where he pastored for several years) on Sunday, March 10, at 2:00.

Bro. Ray, the longest serving pastor in FBC history, pastored our church from 1968-1989.

He is survived by his wife Rita and their three sons and their families.

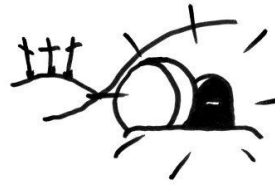

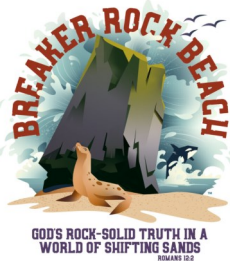
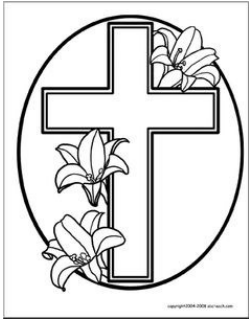
