Moving from El Paso, Texas, to Washington D.C. was quite the experience. For someone who had never really traveled outside of Texas, I was in for quite the surprise: from the moment I landed in Ronald Reagan Airport, to being picked up by my new military instructors, to being commanded that I could not look anywhere but was only allowed to *keep my eyes straight forward*.

An odd command if you ask me, a command that many would deem as "silly." At the time, I was anxious, frightened, nervous, but also in awe of just the amount of green that I was seeing, even by keeping my eyes straight forward. It was a beautiful October day, when the fall season really starts to settle in. You could feel the breeze blowing through you, the great temperature where it's not so hot but not so cold, a perfect temperature if you ask me.

I look back at that day, and I am glad I kept my eyes straight forward. There was a goal in mind, a task at hand, and an opportunity for me to have a fresh start. The old was gone, the new was finally here. In many ways, the end of a chapter in my life meant the beginning of a new one as well. As silly as that command was to me, it really allowed me to soak in the moment in a unique way. I remember thanking God for those feelings. I remember the prayers of those times, but also how much I relied on God like never before.

2 Corinthians 5:17 reminds us, "This means that anyone who belongs to Christ has become a new person. The old life is gone; a new life has begun!" Many of you have probably read, memorized, and probably referenced this verse before. Let this serve you as a reminder that God has given us the ability to have a fresh start. With a fresh start come new methods, but the same Gospel. With a fresh start come new people, but the same Christ-centered love. With a fresh start come new perspectives, new ideas, new goals, new opportunities for us to reach those not yet reached.

Church, I want to say that God has given us a "fresh start." Very much like the command I took that day in Washington D.C., I want to urge you as well: *keep your eyes forward*. Do not look back, do not dwell on what was, but dwell on what God is doing, in the beautiful story that is unfolding right before our eyes. The end of a chapter in our church's life simply means that we are starting a new one. The beauty in this is that God is inviting you, He's inviting me, to be part of this story.
